Site Leaders Corner

Changes to provision of toiletries:

As our move in booklet here at Piccadilly outlines, residents are to provide for their own personal items such as deodorant/antiperspirant, toothbrush, toothpaste, mouthwash, denture care products, shampoo/conditioner, tissues/Kleenex.

*We will continue to provide skin care products including body wash and lotions. We have been finding multiple items of these products in resident's rooms and once they've been in a resident's room, they are not used anywhere else. Health Care Aides will be advising you when products are running low, or more is needed. Please also try to check supplies when you're visiting. As a last-minute option, some of these items will be available for purchase on our "tuck cart".

Laundry issues:

Many of you have voiced concerns about missing laundry and we have been trying to figure out why this is happening and how we can help prevent it in the first place. I know that it is a very distressing issue, and we need to improve our process. Our laundry department and supply stocking in the neighborhoods will be looking at some changes in the very near future. It will involve a more resident-specific system for returning personal laundry to the neighborhoods. Stay tuned for August's newsletter for more details. We will start to offer a labelling service. We've ordered a thermal label printer that will print our resident's name on a heat-applied label. Hopefully this will start in the next few weeks. There will be a one-time fee of \$35.00 for labelling---if you do not wish to receive this service, please let us know. We will have a designated area for families/residents to go through a "lost and found" rack to try to recover any lost items. If you have any missing laundry items, please complete the missing laundry complaint form near the sign in desk so that we can keep track of numbers and try to find the missing item. Thanks for your ongoing patience on this one—I know it's been very frustrating.

Emergency Preparedness:

With extreme heat most likely in store for us this summer, evacuation is always a possibility in the event of an extreme weather event. In preparation for this we would like to know if you would be able to take your family member home (temporarily) in the event of an emergency evacuation? Please let me know if this is something that would be possible. Please assemble a "GO bag" for your resident with essential personal items, clothing. Please clearly label it "GO bag for Jane Doe". Piccadilly Care Centre will have medications and incontinence supplies.

Extreme Heat Measure: Please help staff to keep the building as cool as possible—no open windows/doors, blinds, drapes, when very hot and sunny. Fans are available if you think your family member would like -- please ask staff to try to get one for you. Please encourage your family members to drink fluids as much as possible especially when weather is warm, look for "hydration" stations in the home. Familiarize yourself with signs of heat exhaustion/heatstroke (we have many posters around the building with this information as well). We will be monitoring indoor temperatures daily on each neighborhood in both common areas and resident rooms. Despite all the above "doom and gloom" it is wonderful to be in the Shuswap area this time of year! We will prepare for the worst but hopefully never have to put these plans into action. Have a fun, safe, and relaxing summer!! And wear sunscreen and a hat. 🐱
