







EMERGENCY RESPONSE CODE PURPLE: HOSTAGE/ WEAPONS

EMERGENCY RESPONSE CODE HOSTAGE/ WEAPONS

What does it mean?

Code Purple is the designated phrase to alert personnel to an incident where a Resident, family, visitor, employees or a physician is being held against their will by another individual or where someone is threatening violence with a weapon.

What do I do?

- If you are held against your will:
 - If able, call for HELP
 - Remain calm, if spoken to, speak in a calm voice
 - Consider escape opportunities carefully
 - Do not be aggressive or use threatening body language
- As a Supporting Employee:
 - Prevent others from entering the area
 - Move Residents, families, visitors, and employees in the immediate vicinity to a safer area; if moving is not advisable, shelter in place behind secured doors
- All unaffected areas:
 - Close and secure doors if possible
 - Ask Residents, families, and visitors to remain in their rooms until the situation is resolved and or the 'All Clear' is announced

EMERGENCY RESPONSE CODE WHITE: VIOLENCE/ AGGRESSION

EMERGENCY RESPONSE CODE VIOLENCE/ AGGRESSION

What does it mean?

Code White is the designated phrase used to alert personnel to an incident of aggression or violence against a Resident, family, volunteer, visitor, employee or physician. The goal of the management of aggressive behaviour is to preserve everybody's safety and to address the behaviours in a safe, respectful, and caring manner

What do I do?

- As the Primary Employee:
 - Maintain a safe distance, keeping a barrier if possible
 - Leave if personal safety is being compromised
 - Talk in a low, non-threatening voice
 - As appropriate, try to de-escalate the situation
- As a Supporting Employee:
 - Direct other employees as necessary to reduce stimulation (i.e., noise, traffic flow)
 - Direct others to help keep the situation away from other area activities
 - Support the primary employee in de-escalating the situation
 - Announce "code white" if you believe you or your employee peer are in danger and help is required
- If Code White is Announced:
 - The Supervisor/ Manager will release other employees to assist
 - The purpose is to regain control of the emergency in which escalating behaviours are beyond the ability of the employees involved to control
 - To provide the aggressor with the best and safest environment until de-escalation of the behavior occurs

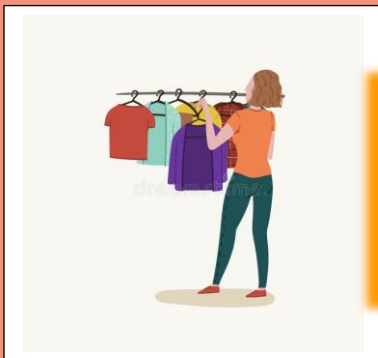

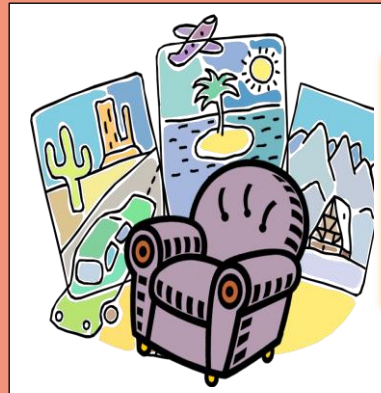

Moment 1: Before contact with resident, before touching anything in their room, before shaking hands, before you do anything with the resident.

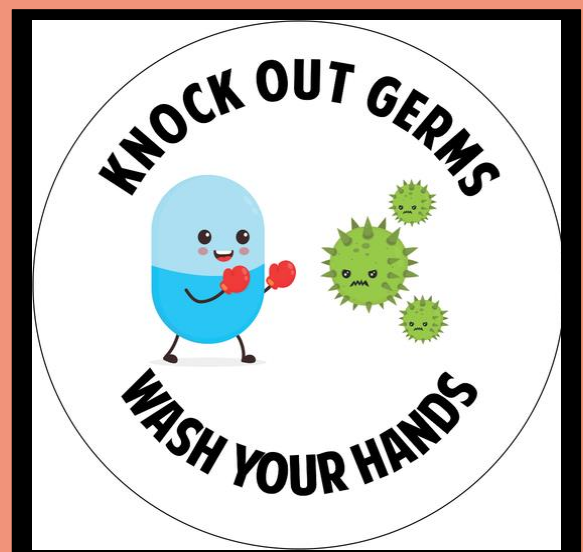
Moment 2: Before clean or aseptic procedure-before feeding resident, before putting eye drops in, before peri care, before wound care, before giving medications.

Moment 3: After exposure to blood or body fluids – after wound care, handling dirty laundry, emesis, feces, emptying catheter or colostomy appliances.

Moment 4: After contact with resident or their environment, after feeding, after linen change, before you leave their room, after taking vital signs, after assessment, after removing gloves.

Flu or Cold?

Influenza vs. Cold

Influenza (the FLU) is caused by a highly contagious virus, which is spread by coughs and sneezes.

The flu is a respiratory illness with symptoms developing one to three days after contact with the virus.

For people with an underlying medical condition or reduced immunity, Flu can trigger potentially life-threatening complications.

These complications can include:

- Increased acuity of existing symptoms from the underlying disease, such as a severe asthma attack if the patient has asthma; increased risk from lung
- disorders (COPD); or worsening of congestive heart failure.
- Pneumonia or Bronchitis; and
- Sinus or Ear infections.

Colds are also a respiratory illness caused by a highly contagious virus which is both airborne (droplets sneezed into the air) and transferred by physical contact. Symptoms develop 24 to 72 hours after infection. The disease is usually mild with few complications.

Flu season generally occurs during the fall, winter and early spring



Flu & Cold Symptom Checklist

Use this checklist to decide if you have a cold or the flu

SYMPTOM	COLD	FLU
FEVER	Rare	Usually present with a temp. of 38-39 C for 3 to 4 days
ACHES	Slight body aches and pains can be present	Severe aches and pains present
CHILLS	Uncommon	Fairly common
TIREDDNESS	Fairly mild	Moderate to severe (unexplained tiredness)
SUDDEN SYMPTOMS	Symptoms develop over a few days	Rapid onset within 3-6 hours. High fever, aches and pains.
COUGH	Hacking, productive cough often present	Common, nonproductive, dry cough
SNEEZING	Commonly present	Not commonly present
STUFFY NOSE	Usual with a cold and resolves within a week	Not commonly present
SORE THROAT	Common with a cold	Not commonly present
CHEST DISCOMFORT	Mild to moderate	Severe chest discomfort is common
HEADACHE	Fairly uncommon	Fairly common
